Rabbi's Message

On October, Joy and Uncertainty

Our autumn line up of holidays always bring us a strange mixture of joy and uncertainty:

Rosh Hashanah: It's the anniversary of creation, the start of a new year – let's celebrate with apples and honey! And, by the way, you're right now being judged by God, and if that doesn't scare you, please note that even the angels are trembling...

Yom Kippur: We're fasting and praying for all we're worth, knowing that the gates are closing and trying to get a good judgment before it's too late. And yet we're on a spiritual high as we draw nearer to God than we can on any other day, achieving not only atonement but also a joyous At-One-Ment.

Sukkot: It's the season of our joy, and we are commanded to rejoice even as we sit in temporary shelters specifically designed not to keep out cold or heat, or even rain. We read Ecclesiastes, with its discouraging message that nothing is new under the sun, everything as ephemeral as mist, but still we rejoice.

If our autumn sacred days and festivals always bring this difficult combination of seemingly conflicting feelings, how much the more so this year when our holiday joy is tempered by the painful anniversary of October 7?

In *Fiddler on the Roof,* Tevye sang "God would like us to be joyful, even when our hearts lie panting on the floor." He was right. And this is one of the great strengths of the Jewish people. Through our long history of facing persecution and hardship again and again, we have always managed to maintain our joy.

Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks (z⁷) once characterized our Jewish capacity to maintain faith and the ability to rejoice even in times of tremendous uncertainty as "spiritual courage of a high order." I agree. I also think it is our "secret sauce" that keeps our lives sweet.

Throughout the month of October, we will have opportunities to gather. We will memorialize the October 7th slain on October 7th itself and again during our Yom Kippur afternoon service. We will celebrate Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur exactly as we have always done. We will gather for a special pre-Sukkot party to decorate our Beit Shalom sukkah and enjoy a meal together. We will gather on Simchat Torah, not to mourn our dead on our day of rejoicing in the Torah, but to celebrate our heritage and our youngest children entering into their Jewish education and giving us joy and hope for the future.

Throughout the entire season, we will be wrestling with these two facts of Jewish life: we always live in times of uncertainty – some of the times more uncertain than others – and we always rejoice in life, in tradition and in each other.

L'shanah tovah tikateivu – May you all be inscribed for a good year!


